The Wildcats reached their highest scoring output of the season in Friday's game, beating Colorado Mountain College 13-0 in Spring Valley, Colo. Eleven Wildcats scored in the bitter-cold contest, led by Hannah Lee with two goals and two assists. Saturday's scheduled game against Auraria College was canceled, resulting in a forfeit win for WNCC.
