Always Lost was recently awarded a grant from Nevada Humanities in the amount of \$3,818.00 for the purpose of maintenance and upkeep of the exhibition, including printing and framing of "Wall of the Dead" panels.

Currently the Wall of the Dead displays 6,528 photographs and names of U.S. military service personnel who died in the Iraq and Afghanistan Wars; with the funds from

Nevada Humanities, we will be able to add recent casualties, bringing the number of dead to 6,720.

Always Lost: A Meditation on War will be installed at the University of Wisconsin, Marathon County starting on Memorial Day and going through June 14.
