

How to complete an effective Scholarship Application & Personal Statement

Eligibility



- O Graduating high school seniors, recent graduates and continuing students who have at least a 2.0 cumulative grade point average are eligible to receive scholarships.
- While some scholarships require higher GPAs, 2.0 is the minimum requirement.

2013-2014 Academic Year Scholarships


The application deadline is March 5, 2014. Submit this form **only once per academic year**. All applicants who meet the general eligibility requirements (minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA) will be considered for all scholarships.

Transcripts are required for all scholarship applications and must be received in the Foundation Scholarship Office no later than March 5, 2014.

- Students currently in high school can order official school transcripts through the high school registrar. Must include the fall semester of your senior year.
- Students who have completed at least one semester of classes at WNC may request an unofficial transcript by going to my.wnc.edu.
- Students transferring from another college/institution should order their transcripts from their current institution and send them to WNC.

Very Important you report the same data on the FAFSA as your application!

- Make sure contact info matches what is in your student center!
- Update it if you need to!





WNC Application Continued


- Program of Study is the academic program you are currently in!
- If it does not match what you have in MyWNC, see a counselor to change it!

Your Career Goal should be linked to your program of study for example:

If your program of study is an:

- Associate of Science
 - Engineer be specific (Chemical, Civil ,etc)
 - Astrobiolgist
 - Doctor (what type)
 - Physicist
- Associate of Arts
 - Educator/Teacher
 - Accountant
 - Lawyer
- Associate of Applied Science
 - Welder
 - Machinist
 - Nurse
 - Police Officer

Submit a FAFSA

- MOST scholarships require a verified financial need. Students are encouraged to complete the FREE Federal Application for Student Aid (FAFSA):
 - 0 http://www.fafsa.ed.gov/
- The FAFSA is used by the WNC Financial Aid Office to determine your eligibility for:
 - O Grants (Pell)
 - Work Study
 - Student Loans



Submit a WNC Application

- Apply online and complete the Western Nevada College Scholarship Application, including a personal statement.
- READ all instructions before filling out your application!
- Do NOT put any identifying information in your statement!
- Apply only once to be considered for all scholarships, each of which may have different eligibility criteria.
- Apply each year to be considered for scholarships--DEADLINE is March 5th.

Creating a Statement



- Take TIME to walk through the writing process:
 - Brainstorm
 - Outline
 - O Draft your statement using a word document, saving your progress on your own computer
 - Revise the statement
 - Read it to friends & family, receive feedback and revise it again!
- Take time to answer the following questions in detail, looking for the most unique or worthy information:
 - Who are you?
 - What is most important to you?


Writing the Statement!

Your personal statement must be at least 250-500 words and should include your:

- Barriers & Challenges,
- Overcoming Adversities,
- Extreme Financial Need,
- Unique &/or Unusual Circumstances,
- Accomplishments,
- First Generation College Student,
- Life Changing events
- NO Personal Identifying Information should be included!

Your Purpose:

- Show how you will be an indispensable member of the student body and the college community as a whole.
 - Demonstrate effort
 - Express your interest (passion if possible)
 - Exhibit thoughtfulness (insight if possible)
 - Prepare your statement carefully



How do you stand out?

- On paper in 250-500 words
- Who are you?
- O How does all this explain you in a unique way? As a unique learner or student?
- Find an overall word that captures your personality as a student!
- Find a metaphor or overall label for your unique qualities as a student: a persistent detective, a coalition builder, a fighter for a particular cause, etc.
- Make this your thesis or controlling idea!



Dominant Impression

- Your thesis can shape how you talk about all of the details of your experience and which parts of that experience are most important:
 - Barriers & Challenges,
 - Overcoming Adversities,
 - Extreme Financial Need,
 - Unique &/or Unusual Circumstances,
 - Accomplishments,
 - First Generation College Student,
 - Life Changing events



- Leave a lasting impression!
 - If you need additional help with your writing, there are plenty of easily accessible online guides or writing handbooks you can borrow from your library. Spend some time polishing your work. The Online Writing Lab at Purdue is one guide you might use to work out any errors in your application statement before you submit it:
