IAC Bridges WNC and the Community it Serves



IAC Strategies

- Provide counsel and feedback to the College President, the Vice Chancellor for Community Colleges and the Chancellor
- Focus activities on the growth and sustainability of industries in our communities
- Identify and promote methods by which WNC may maximize the potential to effectively and efficiently deliver curriculum to meet the needs of the population served
- Work with WNC President to define, form and articulate issues and opportunities to the Standing Committee on Community Colleges for consideration and possible action by the Committee and/or the Board of Regents







WNC Career Hub

- ► The "Common Denominator" for all career areas
- Student Engagement Promoted through Dream It, Do It brand and activities
- Connects K-12 through Project Lead the Way
- Utilizes a set course and curriculum to prepare students to be "career ready" including NCRC
- Assists student in identifying their best case career area for future study
- Culminates with a Nevada Community College Certificate and allows movement into the career area of choice

LEAP (Learn and Earn Advanced Career Pathway)

- Adaptation of Germany's vocational training system to Nevada
- Blends classroom with on the job training
- Advanced Manufacturing Technician is the Pilot Vocation
- Designed to be highly scalable, both geographically and across different vocations
- Provides a fully integrated career pathway to guide students, parents, teachers and counselors
- Honors previously obtained credits at the next higher educational level (no gaps from high school through the university)
